The Importance of Hope

Scripture Text: Hebrews 6:17-20

About the Text:

- 1) The book of Hebrews was written to encourage Christians to remain faithful to Christ.
- 2) Chapter 6 records that some had already fallen away.
- 3) The writer, however, was persuaded of better things regarding his listeners (Hebrews 6:9).
- 4) So he gives them a word of encouragement by reminding to "shew the same diligence to the full assurance of hope unto the end" (Hebrews 6:11).
- 5) He then reminds us that our hope is anchored in heaven where Christ has entered to sit on the right hand of the throne of God.
- 6) Hope is very imporant.
- 7) Why do we need hope?

We continue this sermon on hope noting that we need hope because it gives us something...

I. TO TALK ABOUT

- 1. People love to talk about their plans.
 - 1) Young people talk about their plans for college, home, and jobs.
 - 2) Working people talk about their vacation plans.
 - 3) Older people talk about their retirement plans.
- 2. It's just natural that Christians would talk about their plans to be in heaven.
 - 1) Jesus spoke of such plans to the disciples. John 14:1-3
 - 2) Paul spoke about his desire to depart and be with Christ (Philippians 1:23).
 - 3) Peter spoke about his hope for the resurrection(1 Peter 1:3, 21).
 - 4) Consider Paul's words of encouragement and hope to the church at Thessalonica who were bereaving their Christian brethren who had departed this life.
 - 5) Read 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18.
- 3. Hope gives us something to talk about, sing about, pray about, and rejoice over.

II. TO WORK TOWARD

- 1. Hope also motives us to work.
 - 1) Consider the expectant father who knows the baby is on the way.

- 2) Consider the young person seeking to pay for his school loans or tuition.
- 3) Consider the working man looking forward to his vacation.
- 4) Hope motivates us to work.
- 2. Hope motivates Christians to work.
 - 1) We may have hopes for our future work here.
 - 2) When we take a mission trip we elevate our hopes.
 - 3) When we plan the work for the congregation, we elevate our hopes.
 - 4) Paul often spoke of his future work as well.
 - 5) He told the church at Rome Romans 15:28
 - 6) He told Timothy 1 Timothy 3:14
 - 7) 3 John 14
- 3. Hope for eternal life should motivate us the most.
 - 1) Our hope motivates us to serve the Lord. Paul described himself as a servant, Titus 1:1-2
 - 2) Our hope motivates us to be sober. 1 Peter 1:13
 - 3) Our hope motivates us to live pure and godly lives. 1 John 3:2-3

III. TO HANG ONTO

- 1. If we have hope, we can get through the most difficult things.
 - 1) The proverbial light at the end of the tunnel.
 - 2) We can do daily chores that need to be done because of our hope for some future event.
 - 3) We can raise our children in the hope that they have a good life.
 - 4) We can work through difficult times in marriage, if we have hope for better days ahead.
- 2. For Christians, hope provides us a way to deal with life's problems.
 - 1) Romans 5:3-5
 - 2) Paul knew personally about those persecutions. Acts 28:20
 - 3. When we have hope, we can endure almost anything.
 - 4. Story: Wouldn't send a teacher to work on nouns and adverbs with a dying boy.
