A Wise Heart

Scripture Text: Col. 3:23

When thinking about hearts, there are two we should be concerned about.

- 1. Our physical heart that pumps blood through our bodies uniquely designed by God to do so many things (along with the entire human body)
- 2. Biblically speaking, the heart refers to the mind.

Heartily is defined as "in a hearty manner; very, to a great degree." It ends in -ly, therefore it is an adverb.

One of the ways we can, in reference to Col. 3:23, put the "heart" in "heartily" is to study the wise heart.

      - 2. We have differing abilities we need to use them!
