Simon – "hearing," "hearing with acceptance"

- In a life-and-death situation in Jerusalem yet they saw the need in SamariaIrony: Peter and John sent yet John had desired to call down fire on Samaritans Luke 9:52-54
- 15 Philip could not pass on the ability of miracles
- 16 "Falling on" they had the Holy Spirit (Acts 2:38) but couldn't perform miracles
- 17 2 objectives in mind:
  - 1. Acceptance of Samaritans into the church. No problems like that to the Gentiles, Ch. 11, possibly because of Jesus' dealings with the Samaritans, John 8.
  - 2. Enable Samaritan Christians to function after Peter, John, and Philip are gone.
- Philip see Roper Commentary Simon tries to buy from Peter and John

  "Simony" prevalent sin in the Middle Ages buying and selling of church offices or privileges.
- 20 Literally: "may your silver [go] with you into [eternal destruction]!"

  Doesn't send him straight to Hell, v. 25
- 21 Literally: your heart is not straight

## 3 things:

- 1. Though we are children of God, we can go back into sin.
- 2. After becoming Christians, we still have weaknesses of the flesh.
- 3. Though we sin grievously as Christians, we can still return to God.
- "if possible" not to God's ability to forgive but to Simon's ability to repent
- "Gall of bitterness" Hebrew expression for "extreme bitterness"Gall [gallbladder] is a bitter liquid; literally in the "bitterness of bitterness"
