Jochebed, Miriam, & Pharaoh's Daughter – 3 Women in Moses' Life

Background:

- Joseph is sold into slavery.
- Through providence, he becomes 2nd in command over Egypt.
- He secures a way for his father and brothers to live in Goshen.
- Joseph died.
- New Pharaoh that does not know Joseph or God.

1. Jochebed - Mother of Moses

- a. Biblical Background
 - i. Ex. 6:20
 - 1. Marries Amram
 - 2. Amram is her nephew
 - 3. Not unlawful until the 10 Commandments are given (Ex. 20)
 - 4. Aunt & wife = same thing
 - 5. Common event in the East.
 - 6. Amram lives to be 137.
 - 7. No age known for Jochebed
 - ii. Daughter of Levi
 - 1. What are the Levis known for?
 - 2. Significance?
 - iii. Bears 3 children
 - 1. Numbers 26:59
 - 2. Miriam (approx. 10-12)
 - 3. Aaron (approx. 3)
 - 4. Moses
- b. Pharaoh
 - i. Ex. 1:15-22
 - 1. Afraid of overpopulation of the Hebrews
 - 2. Overpopulation could lead to overthrowing off the throne
 - 3. Knew not God
 - 4. Why is it important to know God?
 - ii. Ordered all the young boys killed
 - 1. Roughly two and older, similar to Jesus and Herod.
 - 2. If all the boys are gone, cannot reproduce for a period of time.
 - 3. It would be hard to train a new army.
- c. Moses
 - i. Ex. 2:1-10
 - 1. One of the greatest leaders of all time. Period.
 - 2. Still today he is recognized.
 - ii. Hiding the baby
 - 1. Forced to do such because of Pharaoh

2. Name - Ex. 2:10

d. Lesson: Be a great and responsible parent.

2. Miriam

- a. Sister to Moses and Aaron
 - i. Instructed to watch over Moses while he was hiding
 - ii. Quick on her feet when she went to get her mother.
 - iii. Be familiar with your surroundings easy to talk about something you are familiar with.

b. Not star struck

- i. V. 7-8 she was there with royalty yet did not get star struck!
- ii. Treat all people as equals. Why? All have souls.
- iii. People like to be treated like normal people.
- iv. God is no respecter of persons, Acts 10:34
- v. Radio Host all equal
- vi. Dr. Pat Spangler & Jimmy story
- c. Obeyed her parents
 - i. She did see results
 - ii. We must as well Eph. 6:1-2, Eccl. 12:13-14
- d. Lesson: Be obedient and a good brother/sister.
- 3. Pharaoh's Daughter
 - a. Don't know 100% who the Pharaoh was at this time.
 - i. Can speculate forever.
 - ii. No Biblical name is given.
 - iii. Since no name is given, we will go with that.
 - b. Facts known
 - i. Heathen Woman
 - 1. Egyptian
 - 2. Known for worshipping many gods, including the sun.
 - ii. Human
 - 1. Had compassion on the baby Moses
 - 2. We need to always look for the good in people.
 - iii. Helped save a nation
 - 1. Because of what she ordered, Moses survived her father's orders
 - 2. Imagine: what would have happened if she ignored Moses?
 - c. Power ≠ Salvation
 - i. Just because she was the daughter of Pharaoh, it does not mean that she was automatically saved or everything was good.
 - ii. It's not who your parents are, it is how much you know God's Word.
 - iii. In the end, it doesn't matter about the trivial things in life. The only thing that matters is if you obeyed God & stayed faithful until death!
 - iv. Stay focused on the end goal: Col. 3:2
 - d. Lesson: Be a person full of compassion like Jesus (Romans 5:8).

Conclusion:

- Hebrews 11:23-26 Mentioned in the "Hall of Faith"
- Notice that all three people disobeyed the orders of the Pharaoh.
- When looking for a spouse, pick one that loves God more than you do.
- Don't be afraid to stand up for what is right (i.e. killing babies, etc.)
- Don't be focused on fame focus on God (Matthew 6:33)
